If you give an hour of your time to your community, your community thanks you by giving you an hour to spend on something you would like to do. There are lots of ways to earn Time Credits across your community, and everyone's time is worth the same. You can spend this on an hours' activity in other community organisations, on leisure activities and at large venues such as the Tower of London.
