On the 10th of December I went with National Youth Arts Theatre, a drama group I am in, to see The Play That Goes Wrong performed at a theatre in the west end. The play has won many renowned awards in the industry for its unique style and plot, making use of physical comedy throughout the play to move it forwards. Plot wise it is based around a group of actors supposedly attempting to put on a performance of a serious murder mystery, however as the name suggests this does not go
