Everyone is welcome

We aim to make our activities as welcoming and accessible as possible. Detailed access information for all activities is on the Events page on our website. If you do not have access to the website please phone or email for details: Tel: 01223 706720 Email: thelibrarypresents@cambridgeshire.gov.uk

At all our events you can:

- Move around if you need to.
- Use quiet fidget toys (e.g. fidget spinner).
- Use ear defenders or weighted blankets.
- Stand if you need to (please move to the side or back of the audience).
- If strobe lighting, very loud music or sudden bangs are included this will be noted in the information for the event.
- Our audience seating is created using freestanding chairs. They are flexible and we can accommodate users of wheelchairs, mobility aids and service animals.

For some activities we offer additional accessibility measures. Please look out for the following logos in the brochure.

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Relaxed performances

Relaxed performances are safe spaces where special consideration is given to the sensory needs of Neurodiverse / Autistic audience members. Neurotypical audiences are also welcome.

- Bring sensory aids, vocalise and move around during the performance.
- There is a quieter space provided with chairs.
- Photos and a video tour of the venue will be on our website so you can become familiar with the space in advance.
- A staff member who has Autism Awareness Training will be present at the event.
- Overhead lights will be off for daytime activities, this is not possible for evening events.



BSL Signed Performances

These are performances where a BSL (British Sign Language) interpreter is provided and where someone who speaks BSL will be at the event to greet audiences.



Hearing Loops

Hearing loops are available. Look for the Hearing Loop logo and book one with your ticket if required. For activities without the logo, we can provide a loop if you inform us at least 10 days in advance.



Live Captioned Performances

The words are displayed on a screen which you hold or is placed near the stage or in the set and can be seen at the same time as they are spoken or sung. Speakers' names, sound effects and offstage noises are also shown.



Audio Described Performances

Trained audio-describer talks to individuals through earpiece creating mental pictures by flashes of suggestive description interjected at appropriate moments. The describer will not speak over actors or significant sound moments / silent and poignant moments.



Touch Tours

If you would benefit from a touch tour before a performance, please contact us when you book your ticket so we can try to arrange this for you. You can bring someone to describe the performance to you for free by booking a (free) companion ticket.




